- Wikipedia: Les communs — en anglais : commons — sont des ressources partagées, gérées et maintenues collectivement par une communauté ; celle-ci établit des règles dans le but de préserver et pérenniser ces ressources tout en fournissant aux membres de cette communauté la possibilité et le droit de les utiliser, voire, si la communauté le décide, en octroyant ce droit à tous. Ces ressources peuvent être naturelles (une forêt, une rivière), matérielles (une machine-outil, une maison, une centrale électrique) ou immatérielles (une connaissance, un logiciel).

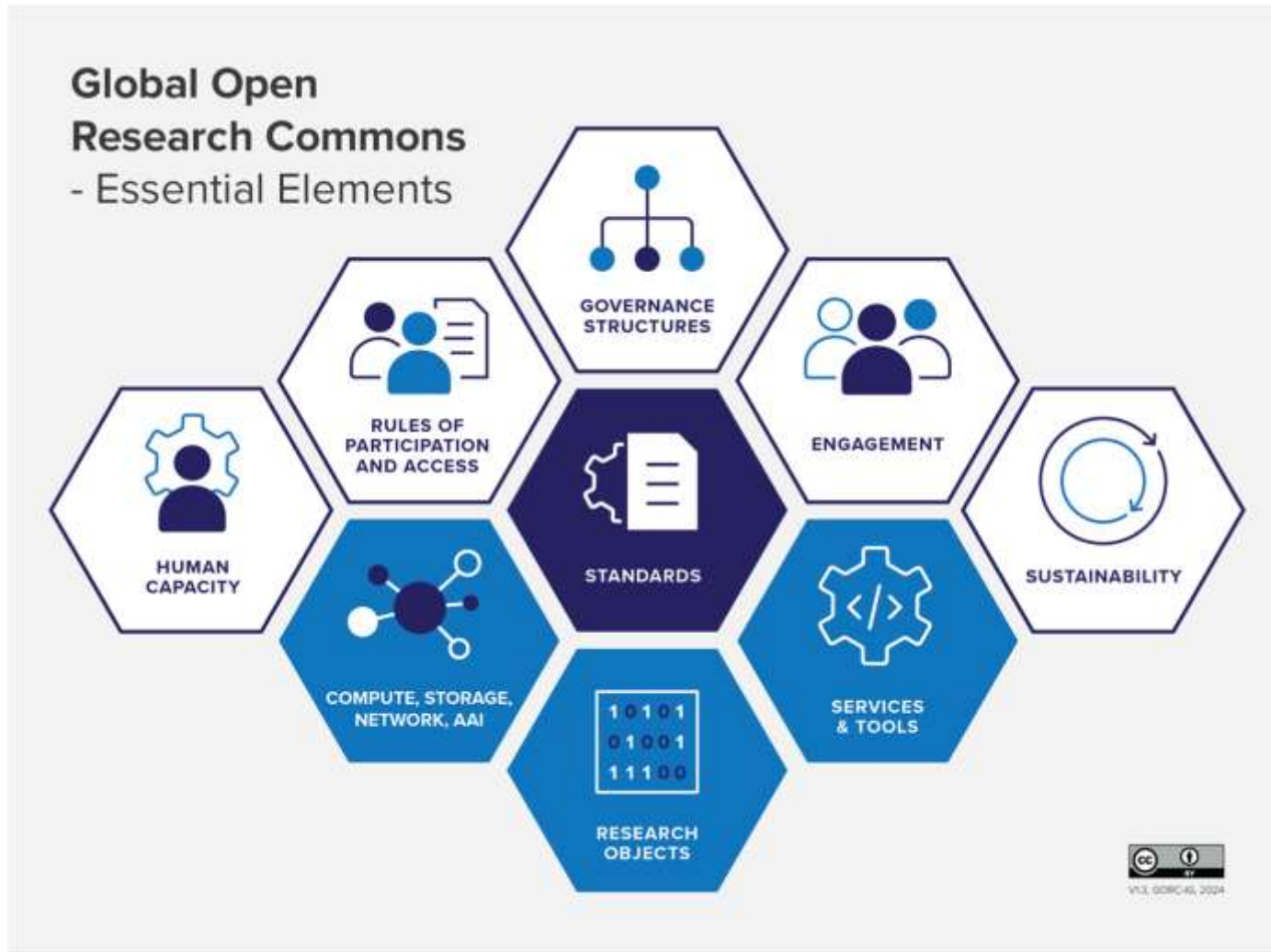

A number of benefits from using the GORC International Model were identified across multiple use-cases:

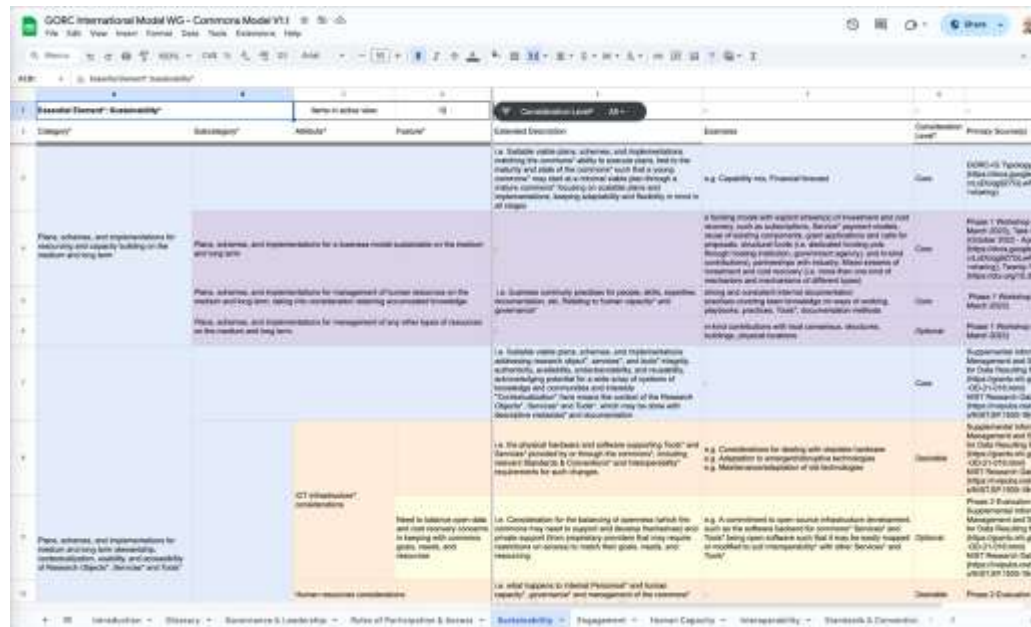
1. To serve as a common vocabulary, such as for EOSC, and for disparate organisations at national scale.
2. To serve as a blueprint for data sharing and governance related to it.
3. To provide a broader context for a specific objective - for example, sharing data requires additional provisions - AAI, monitoring, sustainability, etc.
4. To be potentially usable for commercial infrastructure providers - possibly with the exception of governance-related elements, and by generalising the current focus on research.
5. To be used by organisations to develop their own internal maturity models and measure progress, as well as set up their own benchmarking by describing what they do, how they do it and how it might be improved.
